ONE HORNED RHINO

This is a One Horned Rhinoceros which only lives in the Indian sub continent. It is also called the Armour Plated Rhino due to the

folds of its thick leathery skin.
Two other famous Rhinos live in
Africa, the White and Black
Rhinoceros. Sadly all Rhinoceros
species are endangered because

of poaching. Their horns fetch fantastic amounts in the global trafficking industry as their horns are used for dagger sheaths in the middle-east. The traditional Chinese medicine trade also uses the horn, despite its properties being completely worthless. This is because the rhino's horn, despite its name, is made of keratin (which also makes fingernails).

Saving these fantastic creatures is now urgent. If we do nothing we will lose all of our Rhinos in the very near future.

We need to increase their habitat and living space. But we also need to protect their present numbers by giving park rangers greater resources to combat poaching gangs. These include rifles, jeeps, tracking equipment and communication systems.



FES has tracked the white rhino in Africa, and more recently the one horned rhino in Nepal. This particular photograph was presented to the Nepalese Embassy at Kensington Palace Gardens, and is on permanent display in one of the state rooms. Furthermore other photographs have

featured in many of our photographic exhibitions in art galleries, public libraries and at Liverpool Cathedral.

FES aims to increase the rhino habitat in Nepal and to work closely with park rangers in Bardia and the Chitwan national parks.
