SNOW LEOPARD

The Snow Leopard is one of the rarest cats in the world. They are hunted for their exotic and luxurious fur which fetches thousands of pounds on the global black markets. In many cases this amount of money is many times a peasant can earn in a week.

Another reason of their decline is because some farmers kill snow leopards which occasionally prey on their animals. Not only do the farmers protect their livestock, they also gain revenge.

We are losing far too many snow leopards, for their numbers are continually declining. Because of these population reductions, and the huge ranges that snow leopards have (in areas such as the Himalayas) successful breeding cannot be guaranteed.

We need to protect the snow leopard from poaching. We also need to create a compensation scheme that will give money to peasant farmers who have lost their livestock to these magical predators.

The Foundation for Endangered Species (FES) has frequently visited Nepal, one of the countries where the snow leopard lives, and where we aim to increase its range and population. We have also had meetings at the International Union of Conservation and Nature (IUCN) headquarters at Glands, Switzerland, to discuss these problems.

FES needs to raise awareness of this and other fantastic members of the leopard family. FES are also members of the Partnership for Action Against Wildlife Crime (PAW) where we help try to limit the illegal trade in snow leopards and other rare cats.
